- Reality Based/Police Executive Research Forum (PERF) Integrating Communications, Assessment and Tactics (ICAT) training ICAT incorporates elements of CIT with tactics. (April and May)
- Spring/Summer firearms/defensive tactics training training designed to reinforce the ICAT training as well as annual qualifications (June and July)
- Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) (June, July, August)
- Fall firearms/defensive tactics training this session will include night fire (September and October)
- December 3, 2022 department meeting/in-service training. The training curriculum will be finalized in the fall. We use this to review OSHA and other mandatory training and areas we identify as lacking and pertinent to the entire department.
